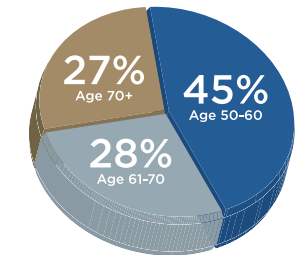

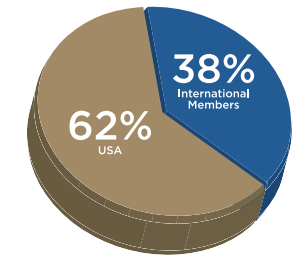
As our innovative dual membership program develops we anticipate more and more International YPO/WPO members joining our Chapter.

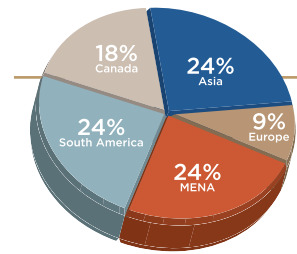
Chapter Age Distribution
